## Shenango Valley Chamber honors the area's standout businesses

The Shenango Valley Chamber of Commerce's Phoenix Awards banquet this year was about more than just honoring its members.

Last year's event was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This year nearly 200 attended the soiree Thursday evening, said Olivia "Libbi" Brown, the chamber's executive director.

"The morale this year is so much better," Brown said after the event. "There's a sense in the community that things are starting to come back — that people are going out and coming back together again."

And the award winners showed a tremendous commitment at a time when the pandemic socked the business community, she added.

Walberg Pharmacies quickly established COVID-19 vaccine clinics at a time when there was a crushing demand early in the year, she said. The pharmacy has 11 stores — including Sharon, Mercer, Greenville and Jamestown — in the region.

"They learned how to quickly create these vaccine pop-up sites," Brown said. "They really stuck out among all the nominees." Also, the business found ways to deliver prescriptions in underserved areas, she added.

John Sarandrea opened Rita's Italian Ice in Hermitage last summer and worked through the rough spots in the pandemic, Brown said. In addition to Italian ice, the business offers frozen custard, smoothies and other creations. "They're really involved in the Shenango Valley and take pride in what they do," she said.
