A vaccine 'miracle'

Urban League, Walberg save clinic in Farrell

FARRELL — Dr. Erin Houston might be used to getting compliments, but the president and chief executive officer of the Shenango Valley Urban League didn't believe the praise she received Monday.

"Did you really say I created a miracle?" she asked the Rev. Terry Harrison, pastor of Val-ley Baptist Church in Farrell.


"You bet I did," Harri-

son responded.

That miracle came in the form Monday of a drive-through vaccination clinic for high-risk minority patients at the church. AHN Grove City hospital was set to hold the clinic but had to withdraw when it couldn't provide enough staff.

"That's when Dr. Houston hit the phones last week and called everyone she could think of to make it happen," Harrison said.
